

Florida Restoration Area

Old Fort Pickens Road Utility Line Relocation (non-preferred)

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This project would relocate utility lines along an old section of Fort Pickens Road in Gulf Islands National Seashore to facilitate natural restoration of the old road corridor. In 2017, Fort Pickens Road was re-aligned to the north to avoid risk to the road and visitors from storm surges and flooding. Although the old pavement was removed, a power cable and force main sewer line remain buried there. This project would partially restore injuries to barrier island habitat caused by the *Deepwater Horizon* oil spill. The U.S. Department of the Interior would be the Implementing Trustee for this project.


